## How do our partners develop these solutions together?

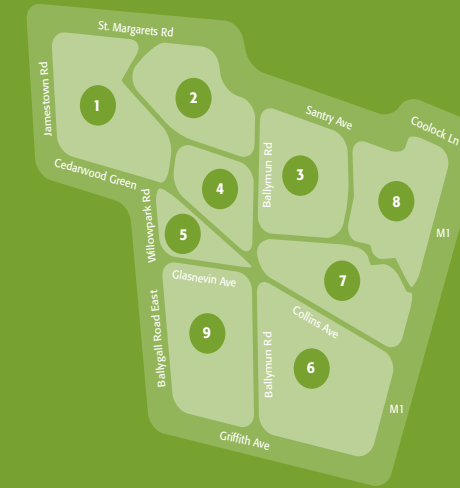
